## 1) Momentum's birthday

Momentum launched a year ago last Saturday. What a year it's been. We now have 20,000 members and over 150 local groups running countless campaigns in their communities. Amongst other things, Momentum's has:

- Formed the backbone on the Jeremy for Labour Campaign 2016
- Ran a national campaign, *Democracy SOS*, to encourage voter registration after Tory changes that could force nearly 2 million off the electoral register.
- Successfully campaigned to get the Centre-Left Grassroots Alliance team elected to the NEC
- Incubated 'People's PPE' and Co-created 'Talk Socialism' political education initiatives
- Hosted 'The World Transformed' as part of the Labour Party conference fringe a four-day event of music, arts, politics and culture at the Black-E in Liverpool.
   Attended pickets and organised solidarity actions for a number of industrial disputes, including the junior doctors strike.
- Mobilised Labour Party members and supporters to campaign for Labour candidates in council elections, Mayoral elections and by-elections, with Plymouth Momentum running a '6 O'Clock Squad' initiative of people who met and canvassed every day during May's local elections, to encourage new members to canvass for the party.
- Raised funds for a wide range of charities profits from the party on the opening night of 'The World Transformed', organised by Momentum Merseyside, raised £2500 for Asylum Link, an organisation dedicated to assisting Asylum Seekers and Refugees.
- Launched 'Momentum Kids', a national initiative to provide childcare for those with caring responsibilities who want to be politically active.
- And much more!

Thank you to all of you for your endless energy, enthusiasm and commitment to building our movement for a more democratic, equal and decent society.

### 2) National Committee

Regional network meetings (which should meet between Monday 3rd October - Sunday 30th October) may decide to re-elect delegates for the NC. The current composition of the NC is as follows:

- 2 delegates (at least one of whom must be a woman) from the North East, Yorkshire and the Humber, West Midlands, East Midlands, Eastern region, South West, Scotland and Wales.
- 3 delegates (at least one of whom must be a woman) from the North West and South East
- 4 delegates (at least two of whom must be women) from London
- 2 delegates from each nascent/developing self-organised equality or liberation group (at least one of whom must be a woman) - BAME, LGBT, Women, Disability. 2 delegates from Momentum Youth & Students.
- 2 delegates (at least one of whom must be a woman) from each invited Trade Union, the LRC, CLP and Compass
- 2 delegates (at least one of whom must be a woman) from each lib
- 1 delegate from Red Labour, Labour Assembly Against Austerity, Labour Briefing Coop, Left Futures, Open Labour and Labour CND

### Refugee action

We are asking Momentum members and supporters to help us to provide urgent support to refugees in Calais camp, which is due to be demolished, and its residents evicted, by French authorities by 31 October.

Please help children in Calais by writing to your MP and Lords asking them to support the Dubs II amendment to the Children and Social Work Bill, requiring the Government to put in place a safeguarding process for these children and protect their welfare. This will be debated in the House of Lords in mid-October and will then go to the Commons for approval.

Although the Dubs Amendment was passed by Parliament in March 2016, which committed us to taking our fair share of the refugee children in Europe who have fled persecution, only a handful have children have safely made it to the UK.

According to Help Refugee's latest census, there are 1,022 unaccompanied minors in the camp, in extremely dangerous conditions - sleeping rough, living in tents with strangers, begging for food and hiding from traffickers. When French authorities evicted part of the camp earlier this year, over 100 children went missing. 387 children have been identified who have the right to stay in the UK - either due to family ties here or qualifying under the Dubs Amendment. The Home Office has been given their details, yet these children remain in Calais.

If you are able to donate anything to emergency appeals please follow the links below - even a few pounds can help to provide shelter, clothing and food and other vital support.

How you can help:

Write to your MP and Lords to persuade them to back efforts by Stella Creasy MP, Yvette Cooper MP and Lord Dubs to speed up the process of accepting unaccompanied minors. Find your MP here and email them, and ideally follow up with a call to their office and/or a tweet. Find contact details for Lords here. You can find a template text for your email here.
